# Baptist Health Foundation starts \$6 million grant process for 2016

**Baptist Health Foundation** of San Antonio has opened the process that will lead to the awarding of \$6 million in grants in 2016

As part of the 2016 Health Grant Process, the foundation is accepting letters of inquiry for 2016 Response Grants beginning April 1, and taking Community Impact Grant applications starting May 2. Eligible for Community Impact Grant applications are 501(c)(3) nonprofit organizations that are helping meet the community's health needs.

The Responsive Grant letters of inquiry deadline is noon on Wednesday, June 1. Community Impact Grant application deadline is noon, Friday, July 1.



The Baptist Health Foundation of San Antonio has begun its 2016 grants process.

Beginning April 1, the foundation is accepting Letters of Inquiry for 2016 Responsive Grants and May 2 for Community Impact Grant applications from 501(c)(3) non-profit organizations that are helping meet the community's health needs.

The Responsive Grant Letters of Inquiry deadline is noon, Wednesday, June 1. The Community Impact Grant application deadline is noon, Friday, July 1.

The Responsive Grant Letter of Inquiry should provide information about the organization, its stated mission, and the nature of the request. Details regarding the submission process for both grants can be found by clicking [here](#). Or, call Eusebio Diaz of the foundation at 210-735-9009.

Community Impact Grant applicants include groups, such as churches, grass-root organizations and smaller nonprofits that help meet the health and wellness needs of their communities.

Funds awarded for the project or program should serve residents in the foundation's eight-county geographic area: Atascosa, Bandera, Bexar, Comal, Guadalupe, Kendall, Medina and Wilson.

The foundation is only able to consider one request per organization per year, and organizations should have at least one full year of operating history.

Since the foundation began making grants in 2005, it has awarded over \$55 million to organizations in Bexar and surrounding counties.
